The Rector writes:

At the end of July I will be joining Steve, my son-in-law and a few thousand other people in cycling the Prudential RideLondon 2018 Challenge. This is a 100 mile ride taking in central London (twice!) and parts of Surrey, where the organizers have managed to find some hills for us.

The motivation is coming from Steve. A few years ago a little girl in his church toddler group died of what is now called SIDS, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. Since then Steve has been raising money for the Lullaby Trust which has two parts to its work. Firstly it supports families who undergo such a horrific experience and secondly it sponsors research into the causes and prevention of SIDS. The Lullaby Trust was started in 1971 and their work has played a key part in reducing the incidence of SIDS by 80%. Steve's contribution has been to run the London Marathon twice, along with a few half-marathons, all backed up with active fund-raising which so far has raised around £20,000 since Steve started. The target for this year and our RideLondon is £2000.

My daughter was due to ride with Steve but has had to pull out, so they asked me to take her place. I am looking forward to the challenge. For Steve though it will be quite tough going. He is not a cyclist and has yet to complete a ride over 50 miles. When he approaches people for sponsorship there is some considerable personal cost involved. I feel slightly fraudulent asking people to consider sponsoring me. It will be physically demanding and take up quite a few hours of my time but I will enjoy every part of the ride - even the hills! There is far less cost involved to me personally.

Is it worth sponsoring me then? Yes, because the families supported by the Lullaby Trust will really value what it is able to do for them. Do I deserve your admiration and even sympathy? Not a bit! The point is, that it is not about me but about the Lullaby Trust. The objective is what matters. Steve will find it harder going I think, but we will both cycle 100 miles. What am I trying to say then? Living our lives in such a way as to make the world a slightly better place doesn't have to be costly but when it is, it can often have a profound significance and impact. The cost to Steve has spurred me on to turn something I enjoy into something that will benefit others.
